I. Evidences of a Compromising Spirit

1) An inordinate amount of time and energy spent with people of opposing life perspectives.

Judges 16:15 "How can you say you love me when you don't confide in me? You've made fun of me three times now, and you still haven't told me"

- 2) An under valued view of *commitment*.
- Judges 16:16 So day after day she nagged him until he couldn't stand it any longer.
- 3) A tendency to divulge too much information.

Judges 16:17 Finally, Samson told her his secret. "My hair has never been cut," he confessed, "for I was dedicated to God as a Nazirite from birth."

- **II.** Consequences of Compromise
- 1) An energizing of those holding opposing views.

Judges 16:18 Delilah realized he had finally told her the truth, so she sent for the Philistine leaders.....

2) A false sense of security that compromise will bring peace.

Judges 16:19 Delilah lulled Samson to sleep with his head in her lap, and she called in a man to shave off his hair, ... his strength left him.

3) A removal of God's protective covering.

Judges 16:20 ... "Samson! The Philistines have come to capture you!"he thought, "I will do as before and shake myself free." But he didn't realize the Lord had left him.

The Remedy: Commitment to Maximize God in your life

1) God's Purpose: Living & functioning as a part of the whole...

Ephes. 4:1-2 Therefore I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, Be humble and gentle. ... with each other,

2) God's Plan: Get mobilized!:

Ephes. 4:11-12 He is the one who gave these gifts to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers. Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work and build up the church....

3) God's Pathway results from transformation.

Ephes. 4:21-23 throw off your old evil nature and your former way of life, ... there must be a spiritual renewal of your thoughts and attitudes.

4) God's Principles lead to a life of *integrity*.

Ephes. 4:30 And do not bring sorrow to God's Holy Spirit by the way you live. he is the one who has identified you as his own,
