Some Key Realities About Redemption

1) Life is a *marathon*, not a sprint.

Judges 16:22 ... before long his hair began to grow back.

Hebrews 12:1, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily hinders our progress. And let us <u>run with endurance the race</u> that God has set before us.

2) God wants our full attention.

Judges 16:23 The Philistine leaders held a great festival, ... praising their god, Dagon. They said, "Our god has given us victory over our enemy Samson!"

Hebrews 12:1-2 (NLT)let us run with endurance the race that God has set before us. We <u>do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus</u>, on whom our faith depends from start to finish.

3) God is more concerned with our <u>finishing the mission</u> than with our comfort in the interim.

Judges 16:25-26 he was brought from the prison and made to stand at the center of the temple, between the two pillars supporting the roof...."Place my hands against the two pillars. I want to rest against them."

Hebrews 12:2-3He was willing to die a shameful death on the cross because of the joy he knew would be his afterward. <u>Think about all he endured</u> when sinful people did such terrible things to him, so that you don't become weary and give up.

4) The greatest opportunity for courage is when <u>self-sacrifice</u> is required. Judges 16:26-27 "Place my hands against the two pillars. I want to rest against them." The temple was completely filled with people. ,,,, watching Samson and making fun of him.

Philip. 2:5, 8 Your attitude should be the same that Christ Jesus had.....And in human form <u>he obediently humbled himself even further</u> by dying a criminal's death on a cross.

5) God works through <u>'work-in-process'</u> people.

Judges 16:28-29 O God, please strengthen me one more time so that I may pay back the Philistines for the loss of my eyes." Then Samson put his hands on the center pillars of the temple and pushed

Hebrews 6:1 So let us <u>stop going over the basics of Christianity</u> again and again. Let us go on instead and become mature in our understanding.

6) Our strengths will yield maximum impact only when they are <u>energized</u> by God's Spirit.

Judges 16:30 "Let me die with the Philistines," he prayed. And the temple crashed down So he killed more people when he died than he had during his entire lifetime.

Hebrews 11:32 ... It would take too long to recount the stories of the faith of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, and all the prophets.
